MOOSE JAW AIR SHOW 2003

On behalf of the club I would like to thank Ryan Johnson and the Moose Jaw Air Show Committee for allowing us to take part in this year's show. I would also like to thank the following RSM folks for assisting with the display (set-up, teardown, contributions to the display, etc): Frank Turgeon, Rob Wheeler, Dave Porter, Patrick Elkington, Gord MacDonald, Kevin Krienke, Michael Evans, Neil Hill, Dave Schmidt, Marlon Schultz, and Lyle Frost.

This year we were set up in the arena, along with the Canadian Aviation Historical Society, as the hangars were unavailable. The day was quite windy and cool to start with, as well as partly cloudy. As the day progressed it got a bit warmer, but the wind and clouds stuck around for most of the day. The Skyhawks parachute team was unable to do their jump due to the high winds (someone commented that they would have had to jump at the Alberta border in order to land at Moose Jaw due to the wind!).

As far as our display went, we had a good mix of aircraft (and a few spacecraft). The theme of the display was the 100th Anniversary of Flight, and we had a good mix, starting with a couple of Wright Flyers brought out by Gord. As usual we received requests from the public for aircraft that we happened not to have on hand (Sterling bomber, Amelia Earhart's Lockheed Electra, etc), but we had a very good mix never the less. We had a good number of people check out our display, even though we were a bit out of the way. Special kudos go out to our club "Pied Piper" Kevin Krienke, who helped "lure" people in with his remote controlled Tiger tank. (Or would that be forced in at gunpoint?).

I did not get to take in much of the flying performances (just saw the P-51 and an A-10

just back from Iraq), but some of the highlights of the static displays for me were the P-51 Mustang (Dakota Kid II) and a number of CF-18's, including one in a Tiger Meet scheme, on in the colours of the AETE, one with tail markings commemorating the 100th Anniversary of Flight, as well as a few "regular" CF-18's. Also in attendance was a T-33 also in AETE markings, a USAF T-38, some gyrocopters, a Harvard, the current Hawk and Harvard II trainers from the base, and a whack of other stuff I did not get a chance to take a look at. Hopefully some pix of the air show will be turning up on our website soon.

We don't have any exact numbers of the attendance at the show, but we heard somewhere that the crowd was about 15,000, which is not bad considering the crummy weather. Hopefully the show will return next year.

Northern Neighbours Day 2003

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. - Northern Neighbours Day 2003 air show and open house takes place at Minot Air Force Base on Saturday, August 16.

The following is a tentative schedule of aerial performances:

1100 B-52 launch, opening ceremony
1115 B-52 weapons load demonstration
1145 5th Security Forces Squadron military working dog demonstration
1210 Extra 300 aerobatics
1225 UH-1 and 91st Space Wing force insertion and tactics demo
1250 Taylorcraft aerobatics
1300 Flying Farmer
1315 B-1 flyby
1325 Warbirds
1405 T-34 Aerobatics
1420 F-117 flyby
1435 Interstate Cadet- dead-stick aerobatics
1445 B-2 flyby
1500 P-51 aerobatics
1510 F-16 demo/heritage flight
1535 B-52 high speed pass and landing

All scheduled performances are subject to change in the event of unexpected operational requirements.

Static displays will include:

- a B-52H, B-1B, C-130, KC-135, T-38s, T-1, T-6, F-15, F-16s, N.D. Wing of the Civil Air Patrol, Vintage Warbirds, Centennial of Flight displays.
- 91st Space Wing maintenance and security vehicles, Bell UH-1N, and an Army National Guard HH-60 and M-113 APC. There will also be an Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraq Freedom hero's booth, where people can meet and talk to military members who deployed in support of these operations.

91st Space Wing tours will include the on-base training launch facility, missile transport vehicle and missile crew procedures trainer. There will also be a force insertion demonstration highlighting security forces and helicopter personnel.

Base gates open at 9 a.m. and close at 5 p.m. with flying activities beginning at about 11 a.m.

For security purposes, guests are reminded that pets, bicycles, skateboards, scooters, rollerblades, coolers, alcoholic beverages, glass containers, knives, box cutters or weapons of any kind are not allowed on the base airfield.

Minot Air Force base is located 13 miles north of Minot, N.D., on Highway 83.
