I try to keep the Antenna to less than 1.5 megabytes in size, so it would be a good idea for email recipients to keep this much space free in their account especially around publication time. I try to get the Antenna issues out the week before the next General Meeting, so if you do keep your email box quite full, try to free some space a week or two previous to the next general meeting to ensure that you receive the Antenna and to help avoid over quota problems.
