Expo 2004 Report

What a beautiful weekend for Expo, and the attendance by the public was great considering how nice it was outside! Turnout for the contest was also quite good, though we did not completely fill all the tables as we have done in the past. I don't think that the cause was due to the number of contestants and entries being down significantly, more the result of there being fewer large entries, such as dioramas.

The final tallies are as follows. We had 33 contestants, bringing a total of 141 entries. Of these we had four junior contestants bringing five entries, and one intermediate contestant with five entries also. The remainder were all adult, with the largest contestant entry count of fourteen. This year we had no team entries.

We had a good representation from outside of Regina, with contestants from Mossbank, Moose Jaw, Saskatoon, Lipton, Ft. Qu'Appelle, Prince Albert, Emerald Park and Pilot Butte.

Door prize winners were Christine Millians and Braydon Cobb, both from Moose Jaw, Cole Clughart from Saskatoon and Kyler McKechny from Regina.
