In some cases, there are people who have made a commitment to build three, four and five kits. We are truly grateful for this and encourage those builders to do their best work. I can assure you all, that it is and will be very gratefully appreciated, not only by the museum, but by those who visit the museum. It is with this positive spirit of Cupertino that you will produce the great looking masterpieces for the displays, opening in early September 2005.

I've been trying to be as fair to all the model clubs that I am a member regarding the distribution of the kits for this project. I want to make sure that all the clubs have an opportunity to be recognized by building items for the museum. There will be signs recognizing the individual model builders and the model club to which each belongs. It is my hope to promote the hobby and the model clubs. Also, I've tried to include hobby shops in the areas where each model club exists, in order to promote their businesses, and in so doing help to perpetuate the growth of the hobby. Are You a Master Modeller?
