Product Review

Tamiya Decal Tweezers

These are made out of nice stainless steel, with a flat large head and tapered edges which work well when picking up decals. This dramatically cuts down the chances of the decals ripping. The end on it is fairly blunt, making it good for moving the decals around once on the subject. They feel good on your hand and have a bit of weight to them. They are far better than anything I've used, and I feel it is money well spent. They can be found on the Internet or some hobby shops. The price is around \$18 CDN.

Photo etched scissor cutters

These cutters look like ordinary scissors, but don't let that fool you. These cutters are very sharp and have a very pointy tip, making it ideal for getting in between small photo etched pieces that must be cut off a tree. They cut the pieces off like a hot knife through butter. They feel good in your hand and you can get really close to the part which means you have very little burr on it. This of course has been a problem in the past. These are worth every penny and they sell for around \$23-24 CDN. They can be found on the Model Express website, or hobby shops. I don't know how I got along without them.

Both of these items are high quality material, and are packaged very well. As the old saying goes, you get what you pay for.
