

The models were to be a tribute to their wives (Allison and Alison, get it?). Dave took the easy way out and built the kit close to box stock. Ron went the opposite way and used only the Allison WWII aircraft engine that came with the funny car to build a Bonneville Salt Flats vehicle.

This is an old kit from the 60's and it shows. The front of the car sits real high because of the solid front axle. This is the chassis. Not much detail here. Dave added his signature paper seatbelt harness. The engine was 100% chrome plated. My eyes are too old to focus on that much chrome so it got bleached and painted blue.



Ron used an AMT Deora as a starting point for the body. The front windshield/entrance ramp and grill were sealed and filled. The tonneau cover, spoiler, side skirts and belly pan were all added and/or scratchbuilt by Mr. Gall. Note that the truck is now steered from the centre.


