KEEPING YOUR END UP

Apologies to track heads and wheel nuts as this is likely to interest only my fellow wing dings.

In any case, over years of modelling aircraft with tricycle landing gear, I have tried with varying degrees of frustration and success expended machine gun bullets, fishing sinkers, bird shot and car wheel balancing weights. The other day I discovered what seems to be to be just about the best source I've ever used.

Having used up all my on-hand wheel balance weights, I thought about the possibility of "surplus" lead one might find at a scrap dealer. Nearest one to me is CMS Surplus at corner of Winnipeg & Dewdney. There was nothing really practical looking in the scrap side so I wandered into that Aladdin's Cave of wonders, the attached hardware side of the operation. Asking around I was directed to their stock of sheet lead.

They have it in large rolls of varying thickness ranging from about 1/16th in. to too thin for me to guess. The price was \$1.05 per pound. Five bucks got me all the lead I'll every need and in sheet format, it fits handily onto a shelf or into a "parts box". The lead is very soft and the easiest I've ever found to work with re cutting, shaping, etc.

So, if you're still looking for easy to use, relatively inexpensive nose weight to keep your tricycle geared planes rear end up, I recommend CMS Surplus for sheet lead.
