Don't throw out those clear plastic egg cartons. They can serve several purposes.

-when closed make good storage containers for small parts.

-when open they are good for sorting parts, storing parts or mixing glue, paint or epoxy.

-they can be used as a thing to pour your liquid rubber into when making molds for rein casting They also can be used for making clear window parts. If you have some kind of crazy shape (like a windshield) you can heat the plastic over a candle and using another windshield as a "buck" you can stretch the heated sheet of plastic over. It will very quickly cool and hold that shape. This requires a bit of practice but it works!

Hot Wheels come in blister packs, if you keep the clear part they make excellent window material. Nice and clear, easy to cut, and is a nice scale thickness. I use it all the time.

This way Robert gets a cool car, and I get some building supplies.
